Afcons made significant progress in Metro infrastructure sector. We bagged three new jobs taking our Metro portfolio to eight Indian cities. We completed the base slab construction at Howrah Metro Station which is India's deepest underground Metro Station. We finished Reach-3 of Nagpur Metro, including the complex Sitabuldi Metro Station, in record time.

Gopalpur and Kandla ports, constructed by Afcons, were inaugurated and have become fully operational. The Annaram barrage, which is part of the world's largest multi-stage and multi-purpose lift irrigation scheme, was dedicated to the people of Telangana. The bold and ambitious project will provide water to 45 lakh acres of agricultural land and is a lifeline for countless villagers. We are proud to be part of such pathbreaking mega projects that are redefining India.

The year gone by also had its own set of challenges. The domestic road (NHAI EPC, and, HAM) segment virtually came to a standstill. Many big-ticket projects like river-linking, high-speed rail didn't move at the expected pace. Most importantly, the apathy among banks to fund infrastructure sector became a major roadblock.

Internationally, we continue to enjoy a growing African portfolio. While Afcons has received repeat orders in existing countries, we're expecting more jobs in newer geographies from the continent.

We will continue to maximise local employment and skill development, including supporting local communities, in Africa. Our efforts have drawn attention and appreciation. We were humbled to receive the Africa Best Employer Brand award for 2019.

Inauguration of Volta Bridge construction

The Honourable President of Ghana His Excellency Nana Addo Dankwa

Afuko-Addo commemorated the inauguration of Volta Rail Bridge construction on November 5, 2019. The bridge is part of Ghana's biggest railway project, Tema-



Mpakadan Railway Project, which is being built by Afcons. A senior leadership team from Shapoorji Pallonji and Afcons, including Mr S Kuppuswamy, Advisor - Group Finance & Special Projects, Shapoorji Pallonji and Company Private Ltd, Mr S Paramasivan, Managing Director, Afcons, and Mr Akhil Gupta, Executive Director - Operations and BU Head - Surface Transport, Afcons, were present at the event. The senior leaders assessed the construction of railway tracks, Mpakadan Rail Head sections and Volta Bridge and expressed satisfaction over their progress. Work begins on Kanpur Metro

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HN AFRICAN TRACK RECORD

Afcons ventures into maiden turnkey railway job; Prepares Ghana for its first multi-modal transportation system

hen President of Ghana His Excellency Nana Addo Dankwa Akufo-Addo unveiled the plaque for construction work to start on Volta Rail Bridge, at Ogoli, in November last year, there was widespread jubilation among residents of the Volta region. In his speech, the President promised a glorious future with economic development and making Juapong an important railway town. The Volta Rail Bridge is part of the Tema-Mpakadan railway under the Ghana-Burkina Faso inter connectivity railway project, and, Afcons is in charge of constructing this expansive railway route.

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The 97.7 km railway route between Tema and Mpakadan is Ghana's largest and most ambitious railway project. It will pass through the Greater Accra, Eastern, Volta, Oti and northern regions. It is part of the 1000 km Ghana-Burkina Faso railway network that will link the two west African countries and improve trade relations. Afcons commenced work in 2018 and is working at a frenetic pace to meet the September 2020 deadline, a promise made to deliver the project 10 months ahead of schedule.

Project of Structures

The Tema-Mpakadan project is Afcons's first turnkey railway project on EPC basis. The project involves over 65 lakh cum of earthwork, construction of 159 structures, including 120 box culverts, 22 Road under Bridges, 11 Road over Bridges and four bridges, seven passenger stations, installing signalling and tele-communication system, railhead facilities at Tema and Mpakadan, maintenance facilities for loco and wagon at Tema. Besides these, the scope includes capacity building wherein railway staff have to be trained on operations and maintenance.

Afcons has conducted a three-week study tour for select officials from Ghana Rail Development Authority (GRDA), and, a 10-week training on track technology for select GRDA track engineers at Konkan Railway Training Centre, Bengaluru Metro, Delhi Metro, RDSO, and, other Indian Railway workshops.

Local Employment

In bid to boost local employment and keep its promise to bring new technology into the country, Afcons established a Sleeper Plant using long line method for the first time.

"Considering the prospects and opportunities in the railway sector in Ghana, we took a bold decision to set up our own sleeper plant at Shai Hill. We have an experienced railway team and we have been producing almost 720 sleepers per day. A total of 75,000 sleepers have been produced in five months, and, we'll achieve the targeted number of 1,94,000 by March," says Mr Udai Veer Singh, Project Manager & Vice President (projects).

Around 80 workers work daily at the Sleeper Plant of which 41 are Ghanaians. More than 80 per cent of the workforce in the entire project are locals. "We are extremely fortunate to have a dedicated team. More than 1,000 Ghanaian workers are employed in various capacities in the project. The locals are hardworking, and, some have been instrumental in liaising with state agencies, managing local communities, handling compliance issues etc. We have experienced Ghanaian workers in our survey and track works team. This project wouldn't have been possible without the overall support of locals inside and outside the project," says Singh.

On the Fast Track

The clock is ticking for Afcons, and, as of January 2020, the project team has completed 65 per cent of overall project work – which includes 95 per cent earthwork. Track laying works are carried out simultaneously so

RAIL LIFTING Machine

Rail Lifting Machine is a first-of-its-kind fixture designed and fabricated in a way that it can do double the quantity of work in comparison to manual rail lifting. The maintenance cost of the machine is negligible, and it can be handled efficiently by just five people as against 25 workmen required to do manual lifting.

that no time is wasted and almost 75 per cent of structural work is completed.

Volta Challenge

In the entire project the Volta Bridge is the biggest and most critical structure. There will be five spans of sixty meters each with six foundations. Two foundations are on land and the remaining four foundations are on Volta river.

"We're constructing a 300m long bridge over river Volta which is in the downstream of the Akosombo dam and upstream of Kpong dam.

This bridge is challenging because of unpredictable geological conditions in the Volta. Piling works are in progress and pile foundation goes as deep as 70m. We're using raker piles in the foundation for additional lateral strength. We're confident of completing this bridge by September 2020," says Singh.

Multi-modal Transportation The Tema-Mpakadan railway

CONCRETE VIBRATORS

Afconians indigenously developed an equipment comprising three electric vibrators installed clockwise, whose frequency can be adjusted as per requirement within the fabricated frame. This was done to ensure proper compaction for the sleepers and less rejections with no honeycombing, at minimal cost.

CRANE ON TRAILER

A swinging beam fitted with sliding chain and pulley arrangement mounted on a trailer is unique to this project. This innovation has reduced unloading time. It is convenient and does not need additional resources such as crane or hydra.



project is envisaged as a modern rail link that will not only benefit passenger and goods transport but also revitalise the rail and water transport systems with social and economic benefits.

The multi-modal transportation system will see goods being transported from Tema to Mpakadan by rail, from Mpakadan to Buipe through ships, and, from Buipe, the goods and containers will further travel by road. This will ease out the pressure on Tema port and usher in an economic boom in the country.

in**conversation** SUBRATA BANDOPADHYAY "Adding value to Lusaka's infrastructure development"

midst the hustlebustle along the roads around Makeni Flyover, Afcons teams deftly continue the construction activities of what is possibly the first flyover in Africa. "We have ensured, at no point, traffic movement stops because of our construction activities. Everything has been planned in a way that people of Lusaka aren't inconvenienced," says Mr Subrata Bandyopadhyay, Project Manager, Lusaka City Roads Decongestion Project in Zambia.

The 930m flyover is part of one of the country's most ambitious road projects. "By introducing the concept of flyovers in Lusaka, the Ministry of Local Government has taken a step towards diversifying and adding value to infrastructure development of the country," he adds.

A project of this magnitude is the need of the hour for Lusaka. The city is Southern Africa's economic hub and plays a vital role in connecting and enhancing businesses across the borders. Apart from Makeni Flyover, Afcons is rehabilitating / widening 68.4kms of lane roads, constructing 26.8kms of bidirectional dedicated bus lanes, three flyovers and five at-grade junctions.

The company is also constructing a building for the Ministry of Local Government, which sprawls over 66500 sq. feet. "Lusaka is a city that rests on the ideology of positive adaption. We have been able to introduce several concepts such as flyovers and bidirectional dedicated bus lanes here thus reinforcing the aim of the project which is to boost public transport," explains Mr Bandyopadhyay.

The project comes with its own share of challenges. It has been designed in a way that traffic movement is not hampered, requires minimal land acquisition and leads to least disturbances related to construction. "Like most urban infrastructure development works, initially, land acquisition had to be handled with utmost sensitivity. Also, Zambia being a land-locked country, mobilisation of resources had to be planned meticulously," he recounts.

This is also Mr Bandopadhyay's first project on foreign grounds. "This has been a great learning experience for me, both professionally and personally. I am immensely proud as well as humbled to be part of a team that is so motivated and gifted,' he says. The team is already moving close to nine months ahead of schedule, thereby maintaining Afcons' track record. This project is a clear sign that Zambia is open to new businesses, amalgamation of cultures and the latest technologies.
