


# IN **conversation**: RUDOLPH D'SOUZA 'KSG is entering into its most ambitious phase'

Afcons' Chief Knowledge Officer Rudolph D'Souza is an embodiment of calm. For him winning an award is just a part of a day's work as the creative genius has his eyes firmly set on the goal. "Our vision to be a 'Knowledge Enterprise' is unique, globally. This signals the belief and support of our leadership to grow Knowledge Capital at Afcons," he says.

While, for most breaking down Afcons' decade-long KM journey can be daunting, D'Souza encapsulates it into three stages - Commencement, Consolidation and Embedding (processes into work). Afcons initiated

> KM and Technical Training (TT) in 2011-12 with focus on creating the technology platforms that were developed inhouse. The emphasis then shifted on content creation and development of an e-Learning module. "Afcons thus became a pioneer in

the infrastructure sector for KM as well as for e-Learning," he adds.


> The KM and TT teams were

integrated to form the Knowledge Services Group (KSG) in 2017. The synergies of this move were reflected in the boost to activities under the 'Learn Before, Learn During and Learn After' model. The pivotal moment came two years later, when a 125+ cadre of enthusiastic 'Knowledge Ambassadors' was formed. Combined with the launch of 'Mission 10000'. they have ensured that the KSG Processes are entwined with project progress.

D'Souza credits the success of implementation of knowledge processes across projects to the passionate Knowledge Ambassadors. "The wisdom of having multiple Knowledge Ambassadors at a project, rather than relying on one, is unique to Afcons. So is Mission 10000, which is an outstanding example of using gamification in KM. While these elements may seem disparate, when put together, they have created a distinct flavour that makes KM at Afcons stand out internationally," he explains.

The KSG is now entering its most ambitious phase. Technical Competency Maps are being created domain wise, and each engineer will be mapped to it. "The learning paths towards the next level will be chalked out. Knowledge Collections is another ambitious programme. Finally, identifying and measuring improvements and impacts in a tangible manner is on the cards," D'Souza signs off.

# MISSION Afcons completes arch of Chenab Railway Bridge ACCOMPLISHED

Il of world's eyes were trained on April 5, 2021. The world was about to witness the arch closure of the World's Highest Railway bridge. And when the moment arrived with the lowering of the final segment, victory chants reverberated around the Chenab valley.

It was no surprise to hear the chants as the spirit of patriotism ran high. It was a different feeling altogether and cannot be explained in words. Dignitaries who had gathered to witness the moment were overwhelmed by the wave of adulation. India and the world witnessed the rarest of sounds - valiant workers perched at a height above 359m baying for the arch closure and erupting in jou.

Not only those who were present in Chenab, but also millions of Indians who have been intently following the event, were proud for the bravery, patriotism, and, spirit of sacrifice displayed by engineers and workers alike.

After the inauguration of Atal Tunnel, the world's longest motorable tunnel 3,000m above sea level, last year, the arch closure of Chenab Bridge once again puts India on the world map. These rare and pathbreaking projects define India's supreme engineering capabilities and prove that

we are no more behind our European counterparts. Afcons deployed the most advanced technology and set international safety standards.

As Afconians, we're extremely proud of this achievement, and, will always put nation first in our pursuit for an Atmanirbhar Bharat.

# **VOLTA BRIDGE, GHANA**

or an organisation that has built bridges across mighty rivers like the Ganga and Meghna, constructing a bridge over a lake should have been just another day at work. However, this story turned out quite different.

The lake in question is Lake Volta in Ghana; The bridge - the longest railway

bridge in the country; And the project - the biggest railway project in Ghanian history. And this was only the beginning as the perennial lake, which is also

one of the world's largest man-made reservoirs, turned out to be a 70m-plus deep gorge. This meant team had to think unconventionally.

Following geological studies, a special team was mobilised to design and execute a 300m steel bridge. The initial profile of the bridge factored in straight piling, but raker concrete piles of 1.6m

diameter was proposed by the team. This innovation is the first-of-its-kind in Afcons' history. As the bridge takes shape, there are many more challenges, and Afconians continue to adapt and innovate to make this unique bridge a reality.

#### BLASTfrom the past

The Airoli Bridge across Thane Creek that connects Mumbai with satellite city, Navi Mumbai, is a key infrastructure project that has been credited to easing connectivity as well as boosting business in the region.

Did you know Afcons made history in the 90s while constructing this bridge?

Afcons was the first to build a bridge across a waterbody by lifting 1100MT pre-cast prestressed box girders and placing them in position accurately with a specially fabricated floating hydraulic lift crane.
