#### PM inaugurates Kanpur UG Metro

Honourable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi inaugurated a 5-km underground stretch of Kanpur Metro on May 30,



2025. Afcons executed the Kanpur Central station and 2.4 km of tunnelling as part of the 3.8 km KNPCC-06 package, which includes three stations.

#### CM Nitish Kumar inaugurates Bhupatipur-Punpun elevated road



Honourable Bihar CM Nitish Kumar inaugurated the Bhupatipur—Punpun (NH-22) elevated and at-grade section of the Mithapur—Mahuli—Punpun project. It has reduced travel time from one hour to 10 minutes, benefiting lakhs of commuters with improved access and faster travel in the region.

## Maha CM, DyCM visits MPEW Missing Link Project





## GMCP completes piling works in Maldives

The Greater Male Connectivity Project (GMCP) team in Maldives has successfully completed the crucial piling works. A total of 264 piles have been installed across 68 locations, including 75 marine piles, 85 shallow piles, and 104 land piles. Piling was among the



most challenging phases, with engineers battling hostile weather, strong undersea currents, and erratic rainfall.



Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi inaugurated the final stretch of the **Udhampur-Srinagar-**Baramulla Rail Link (USBRL), one of the most ambitious infrastructure projects ever undertaken by Indian Railways, on June 6, 2025. It included the Chenab Railway Bridge and marked a historic milestone in the nation's development. Designed to connect the Kashmir Valley with the rest of India through a 272-km railway corridor, the project has redefined mobility in Jammu & Kashmir, establishing seamless connectivity.

t the heart of it stands Afcons, playing a pivotal role in shaping the future of rail connectivity in the Himalayas. From constructing the world's highest singlearch railway bridge to executing tunnels through the unforgiving Pir Panjal

ranges, Afcons has led from the front in delivering under the harshest conditions.

The Chenab Railway Bridge, a global symbol of engineering prowess, stands 359 metres above the riverbed-making it 35 metres taller than the Eiffel Tower. Spanning the deep gorge between Bakkal and Kauri, the bridge has become the face of USBRL and a beacon of

India's infrastructure capabilities.

Afcons has also executed 16 vital bridges for Konkan Railway Corporation Limited (KRCL) across a 66-km alignment in Reasi, Bakkal, Kauri, and Sangaldan. Two of these bridges-Bridge 39 and Bridge 43-have been equipped with India's first Pre-Loaded Spring Dampers (PSDs) to counter seismic loads. Bridge 39 features seven piers, three of which are over 70 metres in height, with the tallest reaching 103 metres-nearly 30 metres taller than the Qutub Minar. These innovations mark a new chapter in bridge safety and resilience in seismic-prone areas.

In tunnel construction, Afcons has delivered five tunnels including T 74 RA (3.3km) and T 74 RB (2.3km)


in the Katra-Laole section, spanning a total length of 8.5 km with a tunnel diameter of 7.25 metres. These tunnels were carved out in extremely poor geology, with excavation volumes equivalent to nearly 30 football fields.

Another milestone is Tunnel T49, the longest transportation tunnel in India at 12.75 km, connecting Sumber and Arpinchala in Ramban district. Afcons executed Package T49B, which includes a 8.2 km main tunnel, an escape tunnel of 7.73km, 20 cross-passages,

two bridges, adits, and the Arpinchala station yard. This tunnel not only pierces through the rugged Pir Panjal but also showcases Afcons' capability to deliver large-scale infrastructure projects.


With USBRL now fully commissioned, Afcons' contributions stand tall in the mountainous terrain of Kashmir. These landmark achievements reinforce the company's position a global EPC leader with unmatched expertise in challenging terrains.

#### **Chenab Railway Bridge**




For the first time in the world, the launching of segments is done on transition & circular curve



#### Tunnels on Katra-Laole section (Sangaldan)





# CM INAUGURATES SAMRUDDHI MAHAMARG PKG-14



Honourable CM Shri Devendra Fadnavis inaugurated the final 76 km stretch, including PKG-14, of the 701 km Hindu Hrudaysamrat Balasaheb Thackeray Samruddhi Mahamarg on June 5, 2025. Honourable Deputy CMs Shri Eknath Shinde and Shri Ajit Pawar also graced the occasion. The PKG-14 features Maharashtra's longest and India's widest twin road tunnels (8 km), along with two viaducts, an interchange, a toll plaza, multiple cross passages, and box culverts.

Afcons achieved a major milestone in MAHSR C-2 package with a successful NATM tunnel breakthrough on July 9, 2025, overcoming tough geology. Final breakthrough by NATM is expected by October 2025.



## Twin Tunnelling Records at CIDCO Water Tunnel Project

Afcons' CIDCO Water Tunnel Project set national records with 714m—the highest monthly progress ever recorded for a TBM of this category in India—in May 2025, and 53m as the highest single-day tunnelling progress in March, showcasing engineering excellence and exceptional project execution.

#### Breakthrough at Bhanupali-Bilaspur-Beri Railway Line

Afcons achieved a breakthrough at Tunnel 11 on Bhanupali-Bilaspur-Beri Railway project using NATM, overcoming challenging geology with advanced support methods across 2.3km tunnel.

## Final breakthrough at Agra UG Metro

Agra UG Metro achieved its final breakthrough at Mankameshwar station on June 3, 2025, completing 8.1km of tunnelling with 10 breakthroughs, overcoming tough ground conditions near old structures using advanced stabilisation methods.

#### Another breakthrough at Delhi Metro DC-07

Afcons completed a key tunnelling milestone at Tughlakabad Railway Colony station in Delhi Metro DC-07, with 566 rings installed at 18m depth, ensuring zero structural settlement.
